The purpose of the Community Engagement Task Force is to provide strategic direction, advice and recommendations to the Governing Body on all aspects related to community engagement. This includes marketing and public communications, engagement opportunities, inclusivity, diversity and employee recruitment and retention. Eleven people make up the task force including representatives from the local business community, each of the City's wards, one Councilmember and the Mayor. The task force will create a final report with their findings. The report will include an executive summary, a deep dive into each of the findings and multiple options and recommendations for the Governing Body to consider in July 2022. Look for online surveys, listening sessions and other ways to engage with this task force in the coming months. ## **Public Arts Task Force**

The purpose of the Public Arts Task Force is to provide strategic direction, advice and recommendations to the City Council on all aspects related to public art, as well as oversee and advise on public art maintenance. Eleven members make up this task force that typically meets on the third Monday of each month. They are focused on the following goals;

- 1. Define public art
- 2. Identify and inventory public art
- 3. Provide the direction to the Governing Body for the future of public art within Shawnee
- 4. Provide education and communication (community engagement) on public art
- 5. Establish policy and criteria for funding sources
- 6. Establish practices for tying public art to tourism

## Community Police Advisory Board

The Community Police Advisory Board was established to provide another means of transparency related to police department operations. The primary responsibility of the Board is to review and advise the Chief of Police regarding the investigation process and resolution of citizen complaints related to racial and other biasedbased policing. The Board also assists and advises in policy development and review, education and community outreach and communications related to the preemption and prohibition of racial or other biased policing by the Shawnee Police Department. The Board members represent a broad group of disciplines within our community and reflect the racial and ethnic diversity of our residents. ## **Internet Exchange Parking Spots**

Looking for a safe place to exchange an item you have bought or sold online? The Police Department, located at 5850 Renner Road, has two bright green parking spots dedicated for internet exchanges.

- The parking spots are video monitored 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- The parking spots are recorded but that does not mean a person is constantly watching the video feed.
- If a person using the internet exchange parking spots needs police, please call 911 or go inside the Police Department lobby.
- People are also welcome to use the Police Department lobby to make exchanges. It is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

## **Property Tax Rebate Program**

We are excited to launch a new pilot program designed to help some of our local families. As long as certain income requirements are met, the Property Tax Rebate Program will pay back homeowners 100% (up to \$500) of what they paid for the City property tax in 2021. Here are a few important things to note.

- Applications will be accepted through April 30, 2022.
- Homeowner must be a resident of Shawnee.
- You must live in and own your home.
- Be current on the property taxes and special assessments.
- Meet income guidelines that cityofshawnee.org/rebates.

# **TIDY TOWN 2022**

## **Curbside Bulky-Item Pick Up**

- Residents will schedule a bulky item pickup for their household directly with their trash hauler.
- Residents are allowed FIVE ITEMS for their curbside pickup.
- Bulky item pickup must be scheduled and completed within the calendar year.
- Some acceptable items are listed below and at cityofshawnee.org/tidytown. Check with your trash hauler to make sure their guidelines have not changed.
  - Furniture
  - Mattresses
  - Most appliances except for refrigerators
  - Push lawn mowers with no fuel or oil
  - Up to 4 foot rolls of carpet (2 rolls equal 1 item)
     (Must be securely tied and less than 50 pounds)
- Only one bulky-item pickup allowed per year.

## **Drop-Off Site**

Johnson County Landfill (17955 Holliday Drive)

Monday - Friday 7am to 5pm

Saturday 7am to 3pm

- The drop-off site will be at the Johnson County Landfill at 17955 Holliday Drive.
- Residents will receive a voucher in the mail for 1 FREE drop-off per residence per year at the landfill.
- You MUST bring the voucher and proof of residency with you to redeem at the landfill by December 31, 2022.
- Residents can take a variety of items to the landfill, including furniture and mattresses.
- One drop-off at the landfill allowed per year.





CityRide is a transportation program that gives eligible Shawnee residents an affordable lift. Residents age 65 or older, OR residents who provide a doctor's letter stating their disability, can take advantage of this unique partnership between the City and 10/10 Taxi. For more information please call 742-6014. CityRide members can:

- Purchase 10 one-way trips per month for \$2 per trip;
- Riders can go anywhere in the City limits, as well as the AdventHealth Shawnee Mission Hospital Complex, Merriam Community Center, and the Mission Transit Center;
- Riders can bring up to three additional riders with no extra cost.

## St rmwater Snapshot

Floods are one of the most common disasters in the United States. Be aware of flood risks in your area and pay close attention to flood watches and warnings. You can do several things to cut down your flood risk.

- Improve grading on your property to make sure stormwater runs away from your home
- Routinely clean debris out of gutters and ditches
- Create natural green spaces
- Install a sump pump
- Keep any valuable items and documents in a safe location off the floor
- Never walk or drive through flood waters. Turn around, don't drown!
- Talk to your insurance agent about flood insurance.



What I like most about working at Shawnee is the atmosphere. There is a culture of teamwork and accountability for getting the best job done as possible. In the pavement group, we strive to provide the best street management program with the budget we have.

#### 2. How does your work impact the community?

The condition of the roads are one of the infrastructure items that we all notice. What our group does is plan a maintenance schedule for the streets in Shawnee. We utilize different pavement preservation methods and apply them at different times to extend the pavement life. We also maintain curbs and sidewalks for the safe passage of pedestrian traffic. We investigate resident concerns throughout the year and install temporary patches where trip hazards exist until we can do a more permanent repair at a later date. All this culminates in safer roads and sidewalks for the traveling public.

#### 3. What is your favorite spot in Shawnee?

I enjoy the outdoors so I really enjoy Shawnee's parks system. I think we have a variety of options for families to enjoy the outdoors at any of our parks and trails.
