Flood Insurance

While you are making your next "to do" list, be sure to talk to your insurance agent about flood insurance. Shawnee participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, so that means you are eligible to buy federally backed flood insurance if you are in a floodplain or on top of a hill. Shawnee also has a low FEMA Community Rating System, a Class 6, which means lower flood insurance premium discounts for property owners.

Flood Hazards & Floodplain Mapping

From tornadoes to snowstorms to flood hazards, the threat of weather is always around. Visit the FEMA Flood Map Service Center at msc.fema.gov/portal/home to see where the floodplain is in your area. You can also request FEMA floodplain map information through the Public Works Department at 742-6009.



Senior Services and Community Assistance

Renovations are taking shape at Gum Springs Park! Gum Springs Park • 11524 W. 67th Street



Gum Springs Park is getting a facelift! This renovation project includes a captivating new playground featuring a soaring 30-foot hot air balloon structure by Berliner Play Equipment. Additionally, all four baseball fields will receive updated backstops and fencing, offering improved facilities for sports enthusiasts. The park's trail system will also get a makeover, with a new eight-foot-wide concrete trail replacing the current asphalt path. Although the park, including parking lots and restrooms, will remain closed during construction, these enhancements promise to revitalize Gum Springs Park and provide the community with an even more inviting outdoor space. Gum Springs renovation is funded by the Parks and Pipes sales tax.
