The Community

Shawnee, population 66,839, is the third largest city in Johnson County and offers a safe, friendly community lifestyle with easy access to two interstate highways (I-35 & I-435). In addition to the excellent hometown services and stores, residents enjoy a well-rounded business community. The Organization

The City has a mayor-council-manager form of government established by Charter Ordinance. The Mayor is elected at large and eight Council members are elected, two for each ward. The Mayor and Council members serve four-year overlapping terms of office. The City Council appoints a City Manager who is the full time manager of the organization.

The City offers a full range of services provided by the City including police and fire protection, emergency preparedness, emergency medical response, street and storm drainage maintenance, comprehensive recreation and cultural events, planning and zoning management, codes administration and general administrative services. The City is budgeted for 330 full-time positions in 2021.

Benefits

The City of Shawnee offers a comprehensive benefit package including: Medical, dental, vision, life insurance, Kansas Public Employee Retirement System (KPERS), City supplemental retirement plan, deferred compensation, vacation, sick leave, educational reimbursement and an employee assistance program. The City is an employee-friendly work environment.
